CONSULTATION/ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY

- In the space below, please describe the consultation process you used in developing this 5 year neighbourhood renewal plan for your community/neighbourhood.
(For example: how did you engage the community, what groups were included, number of individuals/groups involved?)

The process of plan renewal was initiated in early 2018 with a review at the CNRC Board level and facilitation support from Health in Common and a Neighbourhood Steering Committee in establishing a First Phase – Engagement Plan as approved by Neighbourhoods Alive! Following approval, the initial Engagement Plan was designed to establish a pre-planning phase with research & analysis to address important goals, a second phase to ensure community engagement with several options and opportunities to participate and a third phase to focus on plan developments, revisions and community review in finalizing a final draft.

During the months of April and May, group presentations were developed and provided to a wide demographic including Newcomers, Families, Seniors, Indigenous populations, Youth, Faith communities and the business district. These presentations included 12 participating host groups with over 625 individuals participating. A significant focus was also established on designing and implementing individual surveys in a process that emphasized ‘being where the neighbourhood would be’ at 8 community special events. In total, over 850 surveys were completed with assistance from Steering Committee members, Board members, staff and resident volunteers.

Based on the presentation and survey results, reviews continued with the Steering Committee members and staff supports in preparing for update presentation at the annual general meeting in September. In addition to an overview of the Survey Monkey data, five complimentary visuals were prepared with the highlites of “what stood out” from all the levels of feedback. Three of the five visuals focused on the Top 3 priorities of Housing, Safety and Health & Wellness, one of the five provided a general summary of the entire process and the final visual was dedicated to presenting the survey highlites, commentary and specific suggestions for improvement in Chalmers.

As part of the general meeting in September, 110 + individuals were in attendance to view the visuals, access the complete survey data and participate in the “Live Polling” engagement session which was coordinated with supports from Turning Point Technologies. The live polling experience was successful in allowing for additional feedback on various aspects of what was presented within the visuals – with immediate results displayed on the large screen in terms of what all participants were suggesting for options and priorities.

5 YEAR NEIGHBOURHOOD RENEWAL PLAN

Various Plan aspects continued to be available for community review at CNRC offices, posted on CNRC website, circulated with various partners and shared with Steering Committee members, CNRC Board representatives and CNRC staff. Throughout October, feedback gathered from these reviews resulted in draft updates of the Plan in the form of Overview Summaries and Neighbourhoods Alive template documents. A Community Visual to compliment the NA! template document was also initiated and the review process for both document versions of the new 2019 - 2023 Neighbourhood Plan for Chalmers continued with feedback from the Steering Committee and CNRC Board.

During the month of November, final stage reviews and refinements were completed with the CNRC Board and Steering Committee. The month of December was highlighted by the release of both final draft documents – posted at CNRC offices and other neighbourhood locations, distributed to all email/mail out distribution lists and publicized through CNRC website, CNRC Facebook and Instagram. In all situations, we requested any other additional feedback to be considered from the final review process.

In January 2019, any remaining document refinements will be completed and the CNRC Board will utilize their January 14th Board Meeting to adopt both the NA! template version and the Community Visual version of the ***new*** Chalmers 5 Year Neighbourhood Plan for 2019 – 2023.

Following the Board adoption a Neighbourhood Celebration Event will be scheduled to take place early in 2019 as a kick-off to the new year and completion of the 5 Year Plan for Chalmers. Along with promoting the Plan, the event will also provide for a neighbourhood opportunity to thank residents, stakeholders, funders and longstanding partners for their involvement and input.
